Metrc and the Ohio Division of Cannabis Control (DCC or The Division) are pleased to share important updates that include:

- Research and Development (R&D) Testing for Hemp Ingredients in Metrc.
- New Transfer Allowances for Business-to-Business Transfers.
- Updated Transfer Rejection Reasons.

Hemp Derived Ingredient Research & Development Testing

As a reminder, all Metrc packages must be created from a source that exists in Metrc, with the exception of packages created using a compliant External Transfer process as detailed in the Creating Metrc Packages Without a Source/External Transfers guidance.

Effective January 21, 2025, a new Research and Development (R&D) Lab Test Batch for Hemp Derived Ingredients will be made optionally available for licensees to leverage. Any samples sent for testing must be appropriately tracked in Metrc using the R&D Testing - Hemp Derived Ingredient Lab Test Batch.

To submit an R&D Testing for Hemp Ingredients in Metrc, select the respective hemp ingredient package and click the Submit for Testing button. Complete the Submit for Testing action window by selecting *R&D Testing - Hemp Derived Ingredient Lab Test Batch – see Figure 1*.

Transfer Allowance Updates

Starting January 21, 2025, the Ohio Division of Cannabis Control will implement new guidance allowing licensed entities to transfer final cannabis products, packaged for direct customer sale, between businesses.

Licensees may still utilize the Wholesale Transfer Type, and no changes have functionally occurred in Metrc to leverage these new transfer abilities. It is important to review the DCC issued guidance for additional context and information: <u>DCC Guidance Licensed Entity Metrc Transfers.pdf</u>

Important note: Be sure to repackage prior to sending to maintain the inventory/sales history at your facility retroactively up to the point of transfer.

Updated Transfer Rejection Reasons




Figure 2: Updated Transfer Rejection Reasons

In addition to the updates to Transfer Allowances, the DCC has updated Transfer Rejection Reasons in Metrc. It is important to leverage the most accurate circumstance in the recording of the rejection reason of a Metrc Transfer. Including more detail in the Note field is also best practice. The updated rejection reasons are as follows – **see Figure 2.**
